Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, Illinois law requires school districts to “incorporate into the school curriculum a component on Internet safety to be taught at least once each school year to students in grades 3 or above.” The lessons may be integrated in courses currently taught. (Public Act 095-0869)

The recommended topics of instruction include the following:

- **Safe and Responsible Use**
- **Risks of Transmitting Personal Information**
- **Recognizing and Avoiding Unwanted or Untrue Communication**
- **Recognizing and Reporting Cyberbullying**
- **Reporting Illegal Online Activities and Communication**
- **Understanding Copyright Laws**
